GB2. Local Labour Market Information

It's worth understanding the Local Labour Market Information when planning your career - this will help you identify if your job/career is in the area you wish to live in.

A labour market is a mechanism that matches potential employers of people (the demand for labour) with people who are available for work (the labour supply). Labour markets operate at local, regional, national and, increasingly, at international levels, reflecting how economies operate.

Labour market information (LMI) is information about what is happening in a labour market. Information about a labour market tends to focus on: who is buying labour - which industries are growing and declining (labour demand) what kind of labour they are buying - types and levels of jobs (labour demand) what sort of labour is available - numbers, skill and qualification levels (labour supply).



You will be expected to complete a work experience booklet, gain a certificate and work towards a certificate of excellence by completing just a 500 word diary of your experience of work. More details to follow.




How is STEM used in everyday life?
