
The Super Saturdays with the University of Kent successfully took place on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> November 2022. During the first week, students in Years 4 and 5 from our partnership schools learnt about bacteria and discovered how to collect samples for Dr Hargreaves, from the University of Kent, to return to the Bioscience Department to incubate in their laboratory. The agar plates showed some interesting results but overall Chatham Grammar turned out to be a very clean academy! Students also actively demonstrated just how far a human sneeze can travel and spread germs and bacteria!

Marketing is underway for our next event, which is a careers focused workshop running in January 2023. Students from our partnership schools in Years 5 and 6 will be able to attend.
