Chatham Grammar Holocaust Study Day at the Imperial War Museum

In January, our Year 9 students took part in a Holocaust Study Day at the Imperial War Museum, London. This enabled the students to consolidate their learning of the conditions and ideas that led to the Holocaust. The Education Department at the museum delivered a thought-provoking session that encouraged our students to consider the different stages that led to the Final Solution, during the Second World War. Students were given tablets to guide their visit through the new Holocaust Exhibition at the museum. In addition, our students were given the opportunity to consider the challenges facing a museum when curating an exhibition on the Holocaust.





A Survivor of Genocide to mark Holocaust Memorial Day

On Monday 30th January 2023, Chantal Uwamahoro joined the History Department at Chatham Grammar. Chantal is a survivor of the 1994 genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda. Chantal shared her story of survival and migration to Britain with our Year 9 students, to consolidate their understanding of genocide since the term was first used by Raphael Lemkin in 1944.

Miss Slater is extremely proud of our Year 9 students, as they listened attentively and then asked some impressive questions to understand more of Chantal's personal experience and her views about ongoing historical debates. I would like to thank Chantal and the Ishami Foundation for their support in organising this learning experience for our students. It has given us all a lot to think about and reflect on.

A huge well done to the students that competed.








PE Bike Ability Challenge

As Secondary National Offer Day approaches on 1st March 2023, our marketing is currently underway to promote our Appeals Process Meeting due to take place on 6th March 2023. 
Understanding Adolescent Mental Health Lecture
