Students listened to a variety of guest speakers, including two very inspirational talks from Commonwealth Champions Ama Agbeze (England netball international) and Georgia-Mae Fenton (British artistic gymnast), together with the GB Women's Tag Rugby Team.

There were a variety of taster sessions for the students to take part in which included; trampolining, boxing, badminton and netball to name but a few! There was also the opportunity to discuss career paths within the world of sport.

#### **Inspirational Speakers**

Sixth Form students were invited to attend virtual engagement sessions from CeCe Sammy Lightfoot and Ella d'Amato which were streamed in the common room on International Women's Day.

CeCe Sammy Lightfoot is a classically trained musician and one of the world's leading vocal and performance coaches. As a patron of The Arts and champion of young people, CeCe believes that creativity is the key to unlocking each person's unique potential and aims to impart this knowledge to as many people as possible, no matter their age, background, or the challenges they have faced.

Ella d'Amato has worked in several different sectors, from retail, to hospitality, to law, to chiropractics. By 23, she'd found a job in marketing and quickly progressed up the ranks at Omnicom in London. She went on to be MD of DRUM, a content and social agency at 29, and CEO at 33. Her own background makes her a passionate advocate for social mobility as well as an executive coach, lover of fashion and mother-of-two.

#### Parent/Carer Ofsted Survey Results


Thank you to our parents and carers who kindly took the time to complete the recent online survey. We received a total of 205 responses and overall we are pleased with the results. However, there is always room for improvement and so we are looking at the following areas:

Firstly, we want to ensure that we are open and transparent with all our communications regarding your child's learning. We plan to provide more comprehensive information with you via the termly and annual year group letters around subjects, the curriculum offer linking to more detailed information on our website.

We challenge our young people at Chatham Grammar and we strive for academic excellence, but we don't think we fully celebrate and share our students achievements - current and also those that have left by sharing good news stories, celebrating the career pathways of those that have left CG to enjoy fulfilling and rewarding career opportunities. We plan to share more news and articles with you celebrating student successes.

Keeping you informed about the progress of your child is so important and how we relay information is key to you understanding how you can best support and encourage your child to maximise their time at Chatham Grammar. Feedback from parents/carers and staff suggests that we could look at how the reports are detailed and we are proposing that we use numerical language to update and inform you rather than rhetoric such as, emerging or exceeding etc.

# Duke of Edinburgh's Award

After completing their expedition training, 90 Year 9 Bronze Award students accomplished their practice expedition on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> March 2022. All students worked hard and found the two days very tiring but a great experience.

Students experienced a range of different workshops, developing skills that they will need on their assessed expedition. Students took part in sessions in cooking outdoors, pitching tents, first aid and navigation. Students also completed a practise walk, in which they were remotely supervised to simulate the conditions that they will be in for their assessed expedition.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> March the students embarked on their assessed expedition which involves a two day expedition with a night in a tent. Students navigated themselves around the Kent countryside, set up camp and cooked in order to pass their expedition section. This is the section that students find most challenging but also the most rewarding!



# World Book Day - The Triwizard Tournament

Not only is it 25 years since World Book Day was founded, but it is also 25 years since the first Harry Potter book was published! To celebrate this landmark year, the library hosted its very own Triwizard Tournament!

The Tournament consisted of three challenges released every week during the month of March: Trial One was an epically difficult World Book Day quiz and we had an astounding 320 entries! Trial Two was a CV writing competition to support National Careers Week – students had to write a CV for a book or film villain. Trial Three was the Fancy Dress competition, where students could dress up as their favourite book characters. As well as this, we also hosted a Harry Potter Live Quiz in the library after school.



The students accrued Leadership Points (and prizes!) for entering each challenge, each vying to be the top-earning student from each House, which wins them the title of Triwizard Champion! The Tournament has been a huge success, with over 400 different students entering competitions from across the academy. Thousands of Leadership Points have been awarded – and we await the final numbers to see who the four Triwizard Champions will be!

Students could browse through information about all the different flags, their colour meanings, their history, as well as their inventors. # UKAT Therapy Dog

Blu the academy's therapy dog, has been working hard assisting some students with their speaking and listening exams, which helps them gain confidence to speak out loud for their important exam.

Blu is at the academy every Monday and Friday and see's our students on a one-to-one basis with Ms Franqueira or as small groups of no more than three. Sessions are for a maximum of 15-20 minutes to ensure that Blu doesn't get over stimulated and exhausted.

Blu supports students in other areas such as bereavement therapy, stress and anxiety therapy, and talking and reading therapy (as mentioned above).

Blu is trained under the Pets as Therapy scheme and is super calm and unfazed by anyone. If students would like to see Blu, they need to speak with their year group Pastoral Manager or PT's.
