Annual Library Book Cover Competition



Apprenticeship Journey Success


As soon as Lauren started Year 13 in the UKAT Sixth Form, she started applying for apprenticeships on different websites such as UCAS, Gov.UK, and Rate My Apprenticeship. She was unsure on what she actually wanted to do, but knew that she had always enjoyed problem solving and working with numbers/data, so started applying for higher and degree apprenticeships in auditing and accounting. Before applying Lauren was unaware of all the different stages of the application process, but ensured that she took her time and completed them all. Recently, Lauren has been contacted by a company that originally declined her application; they have said that her CV portrayed qualities that they're looking for and some more opportunities opened up so invited her to attend an online interview. Lauren tells us that she was very nervous at first, but as soon the interview got underway she felt like it was having a conversation about herself and she was able to show her true personality.

The next day Lauren was contacted by the company to be advised that she was successful at interview and they offered her the degree apprenticeship to study as a trainee auditor.
