

The Chatham Grammar team finished joint first place in their group and went on to be placed fifth place overall out of 12 schools.


The students were a credit to the academy, showing exemplary sportspersonship and behaviour.

## Water Sports Trip

On Sunday 16th July 2023, the Chatham Grammar PE Department took 40 students to the Bella Italia Village in Lignano Sabbiadoro in Italy.

It is a spectacular peninsula on the Adriatic Sea, just off the coast line from Venice. As one of the main northern Italian summer resorts, it boasts 8km of golden sands on its blue flag beaches on the Lignano Riviera. The Bella Italia is a self-contained sports resort, which is set in 60 hectares of pine forest, and has over a kilometre of its own beach.

The students all had an amazing time taking part in various water activities, which included paddle boarding, kayaking, windsurfing and sailing. They also got the opportunity to attend Italy's number one award-winning themed waterpark, Caribe bay.

## University of Kent Super Saturdays



Our last University of Kent (UoK) Super Saturday Series, Exploring The World Around Us, was successfully delivered by the University of Kent's Human Social Sciences Department, and took place over three Saturdays from 10th to 24th June 2023. Primary students in Year 4 and Year 5 explored a range of topics related to nature and society including adaptation, conservation, forensics and social research. As usual, a fantastic team of UoK ambassadors and Chatham Grammar (CG) staff supported the sessions.

The Chatham Grammar Experience provided a great opportunity for primary students to visit Chatham Grammar, and participate in a programme of six after school curriculum-based taster workshops; Art, Biology,






English, Music, Physics, Chemistry and Sports were on offer. The students participating were very enthusiastic and excited to learn, gaining a unique and personal insight into secondary education life.

Year 5 students from three of our partnership schools took part in the Stings and Things Science workshops on 7th and 13th July 2023 at CG. Approximately 180 students participated along with their teachers.

Dr Hargreaves, from the University of Kent's Bioscience Department, delivered the workshops supported by several fantastic UoK Ambassadors.

The students learnt about some of nature's stings and the PH scale, discovering and understanding what kinds of substances in their own environments are acidic and alkaline. The students were keen to get investigating, including mixing alkaline and acidic substances to create gradients of colour!
