Students were invited to prepare and deliver 5-minute speeches on a topic of their choosing. The standard was extremely high and all of our students represented themselves and the academy with distinction. In the end, Chatham Grammar was awarded both winner (Rose, Year 9) and runner-up (Naomi,

Year 9) positions in the 11 to 14 years category and were very unlucky not to feature in the older category prizes. Regardless, it was an excellent performance by all and an experience I'm sure they'll remember for a long time.

The new academic year saw the STEM club kickstart its series of themed sessions with students being tasked to design and make their own devices to deliver humanitarian aid. Before testing their devices, students set the scene by scripting and directing their own film news reports, some natural on-screen charisma was on display!

Student Reviews

Students were then invited to take part in our Forensic Science series, Rachitha in Year 10, reflects on her experience:

“My experiences so far this year in STEM club has been fun and interesting. Recently, we investigated a staged crime scene. We learnt lots about a forensic scientists’ job, and how they gather and collect data! My favourite part was using my problem-solving skills trying to figure out how the victim died, there was so much evidence left in the crime scene, I was really surprised! It was very enlightening being in the shoes of a forensic scientist, as I learnt a lot about the pros and cons of the job. We also had a visit from a forensic scientist from the MET Police; after leaving the discussion I felt amazed at just how many methods there are to collect evidence, the job itself seems so interesting, but intense. I never knew that forensic scientists could do so much to help the police and society as a whole. I was able to broaden my knowledge by learning these new things and by attending this amazing club. As I am unsure of what I want to be when I am older, this club was able to help me further widen my perspective on choices and pathways. Next session, we are going to solve the murder case and I can’t wait, hopefully we can figure out who the murderer is and the motive!”

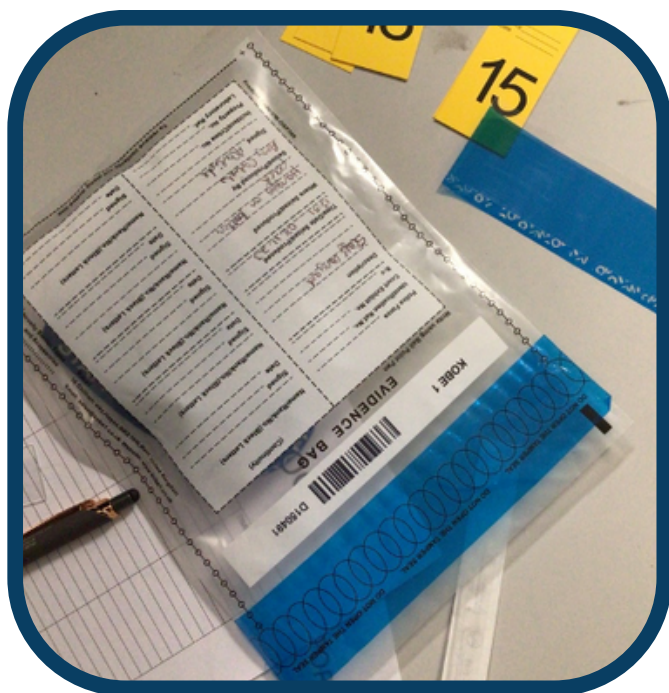
Angel in Year 7, provides another perspective on our most recent sessions: “These past few weeks we have been looking at forensic science. I really enjoyed doing the staged crime scene. I enjoyed looking for small evidence, collecting fingerprints and swabbing the (fake) blood. I was assigned the role of crime scene investigator, as a team we worked together. There were some people who photographed the evidence, some who collected the evidence, while others drew pictures of the crime scene. An example of some of the evidence; a mug with fingerprints, a handbag containing an ID, ultrasound picture and more. We collected evidence wearing gloves and used special bags to package the evidence. I definitely enjoyed listening to the forensic scientist who visited. I enjoyed hearing about what she does for her job and what it is like. I was surprised how much work they do on a daily basis and how busy it is. My favourite part was wearing the special PPE used in a crime scene, and learning more about forensic scientists. I am looking forward to the next session to see who did the murder and I can’t wait to put all the evidence together.”



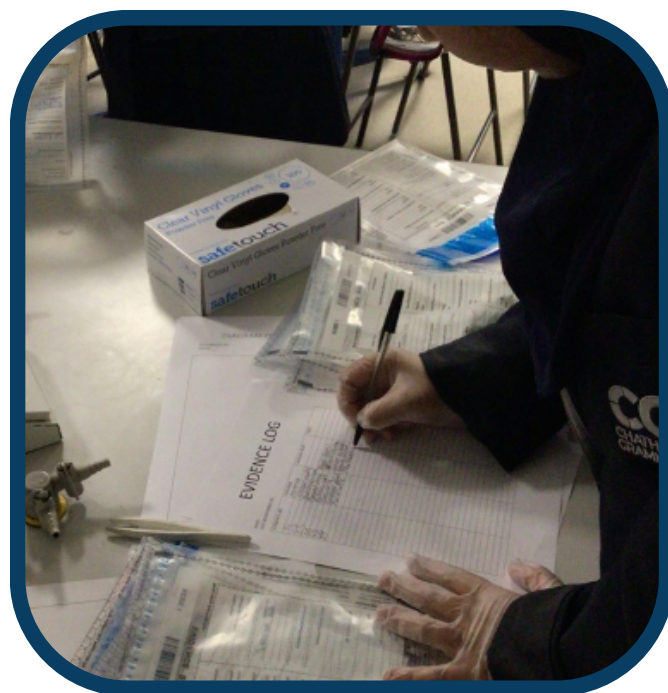


