Safer Internet Day 2024

Partnership Development Programme

Our latest University of Kent Super Saturday series - Crime Busters was successfully delivered by the STEM Outreach Department staff, at the University of Kent (UoK), and took place over three weeks starting from 20th January 2024.

Primary students in Year 4 and Year 5, from our partnership schools, began by learning about various methods used by forensic scientists to solve crimes, such as fingerprinting and ink testing, as well as learning how to collect evidence and test in a scientific laboratory. Students also made their own fingerprint keyring to take home.

During week two, the students worked within our own crime scene at Chatham Grammar. Students logged the evidence left behind using all of their forensic skills to determine the suspects, and finally identify the prime suspect based on the evidence!

In our final week, the students harnessed their creativity by becoming budding authors imagining themselves as newly retired crime scene investigators, using their wealth of experience to create their very own detective fiction!



Due to the popularity, there will be another opportunity for students to delve into the world of forensics again for a one-off condensed University of Kent Super Saturday - Crime Busters, on 9th March 2024. Registration details have gone out to our partnership schools.

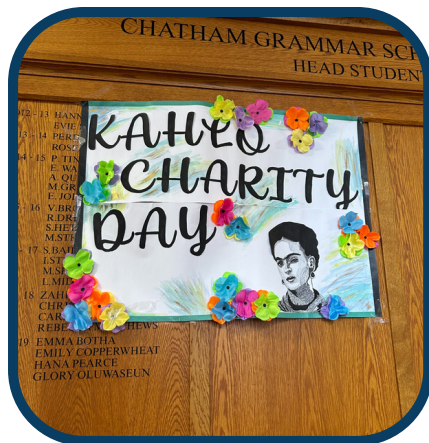

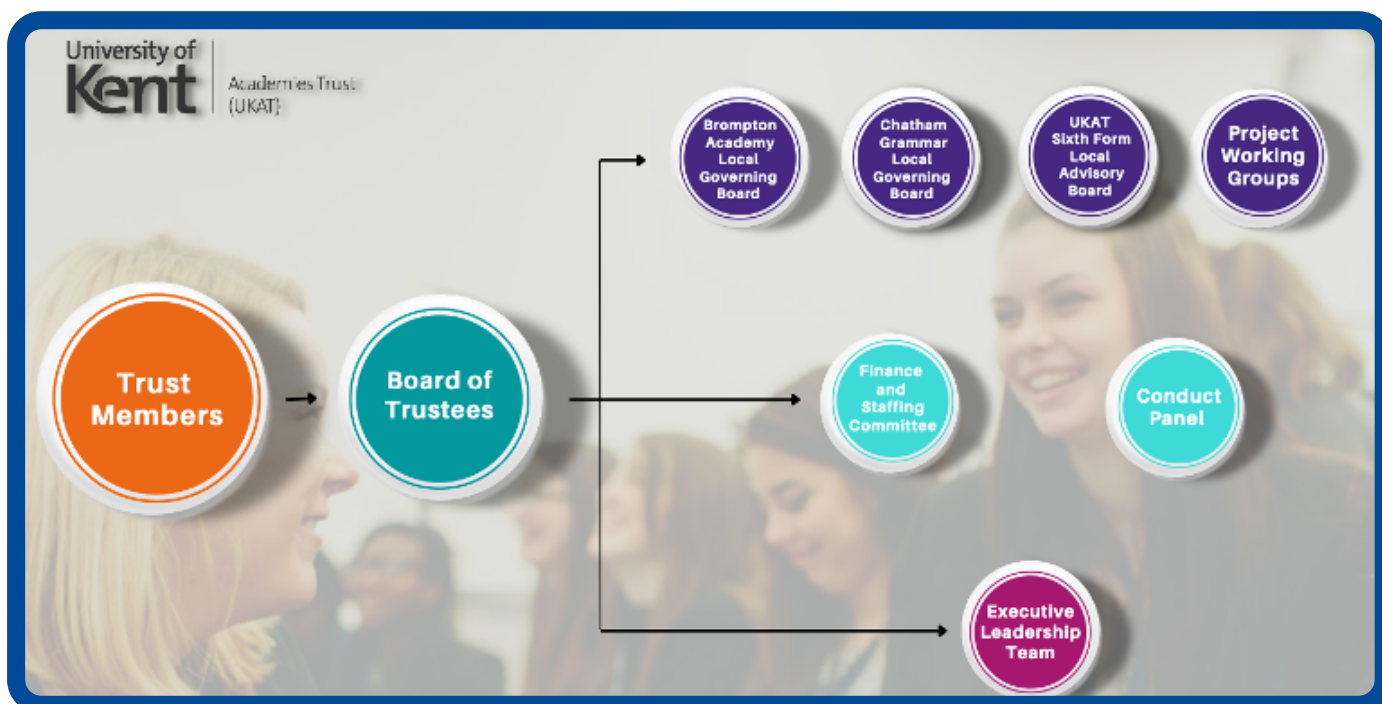
UKAT Governing Board Update

The two-part series will be delivered by Dr Chloe Farahar, from Aucademy, on Monday 22nd and 29th April 2024 for parents, carers, and relatives of autistic young people. The sessions will take place at Brompton Academy.

Monday 22nd April: In this session, Dr Farahar demonstrates a critical perspective on what is presently called “autism spectrum disorder”, presenting the more tangible and varied Autistic experience perspective.

Monday 29th April: In this session, Dr Farahar discusses the evidence for the use of CBT with Autistic people, and asks attendees to consider the wellbeing of Autistic people and not how to change Autistic experience.

Please note that the sessions contain real-life narratives about being Autistic.
