DSA FUNDED SUPPORT

- Support could include:
- Specialist Tutor Support
- Specialist Mentor Support
- Hardware and Software
- Other specialist equipment and learning support
- Travel Allowance

IMPORTANT POINTS APPLY NOW

The application process can take up to <u>14 weeks</u>

 You do not have to wait for A-Level results or have a confirmed university place/choice before applying

 The DSA is government funding to provide support for any student with a condition that affects or hinders their ability to study

IMPORTANT POINTS APPLY NOW

 It is not a loan and does not affect any other finance you might be applying for while at University

 It is available to all full-time students (and most part-time students) with almost any disability, specific learning difficulty, medical or mental health condition that might need support

 EU students and students in receipt of bursaries and other academic funding will not normally be eligible, but may be in some instances


IMPORTANT POINTS APPLY NOW

Concerns raised by parents and pupils:

- Specific learning difficulties (dyslexia, dyspraxia) Post-16 is no longer a requirement; tests must meet with SpLD Assessment Standards Committee (SASC) requirements: <u>https://www.sasc.org.uk/</u>
- Change of GP when moving away from home
- Sensitive data; sending to HEPs, SFE, Support Staff (Tutor/Mentor)
- Student choice as Client

NEEDS ASSESSMENT INTERVIEW DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN ADVANCE

What is a Needs Assessment?

- 1. Funding letter (DSA1)
- 2. Evidence of your medical condition or SpLDs
- 3. Pre-assessment Questionnaire (PAF)

Our normal appointment waiting time is 3-4 days, simply to allow for paperwork to be collated and organised Same day appointments if all documents available (Do not send original documents & always keep a copy)

Check your eligibility; book a preliminary appointment with us today

- As soon as you have your DSA1 Letter we can confirm your appointment immediately
